How does PIE work?

When you enroll in PIE, you get a full partnership with your teacher.

The PIE Program is responsible for providing the planning, instruction, and assessment of Language Arts, Science, Social Studies, and ADST as well as classroom resources, and online subscriptions managed by your PIE Program. This is accomplished through 30 5.5 hour days of classroom instruction, 3 field trips and 3 parent teacher meetings. The overall methodology of this program is to incorporate Project-Based Learning and Inquiry-Led Learning Opportunities.

The Learner and Parent(s) are responsible for completing individual project work sent home between PIE classes. It is imperative that each stage of a project is completed on time since there is only one day a week when the group works together. Through our online platforms, the PIE teacher will post assignment details, downloadable resources, and helpful weblinks for the parent on mYrcoa and for the learner on FreshGrade. You will work with your child to review the Practice & Project assignments and plan the week so the work is finished before the next class.



Parents must commit to attending at least one field trip in the year as a chaperone. Transportation to and from field trips is the parent's responsibility. Parents are welcome to network with each other to arrange carpooling but RCOA staff cannot provide transportation.

The Family's Home Learning Support Teacher (HLST) is responsible for recommending resources, mentoring the home-learning parent, and assessing learner progress in Math, Health & Careers, PE, Fine Arts, Christian Foundations, and International Languages.

If your child is attending one of our Community Classes, both your PIE teacher and your HLST will include the learning happening at the Community Class your child attends.
