How does PIE work? What about High School?

Each PIE class has over 200 hours of classroom instruction focused on Language Arts skill development provided through multi grade and thematic social studies, science, and ADST units. Support continues from home via Fresh Grade. Students learn together under the guidance of a subject specialist teacher who weave course concepts into motivating projects & thought provoking presentations. From home students access course materials, submit assignments, and receive feedback through mYrcoa or Fresh Grade.



Project Based Quality instruction through games, projects, and interesting themes.

Blended Learning

One day a week in a classroom with a teacher and other learners, then home to do projects, skill practice, and assignments.



Tons more! Small class sizes, field trips, group presentation skills, inquiry focus, group games, full access to RCOA Loanables.

When you enroll in PIE, you get a full partnership with your teacher.

The PIE Program is responsible for providing the planning, instruction, and assessment of **Language Arts**, **Science**, **Social Studies** and the new BC Ed Plan area of **Applied Design**, **Skills & Technology** as well as classroom resources, online subscriptions managed by your PIE Program. This will be accomplished through 30 days of 6 hour long classroom instruction, 3 field trips, and an additional 3 days of staff meetings. The overall methodology of this program is to incorporate Project-Based Learning and Inquiry-Led Learning Opportunities.

High School Activities, Clubs, & Classes

Activities – these are one or two time 'events' listed on a calendar. Students are welcome to attend one, some or all of the activities. Activities are mostly free. You may use ministry funds to pay fees.

Clubs – these are sessions of 6 or more meeting times. They do not provide full course coverage but do a great job of providing a healthy supplement to curriculum studied at home. There is a fee to attend. You may use ministry funds to pay the fees.

Classes – classes offer FULL course curriculum under the guidance of an RCOA teacher or qualified instructor. Think of them like a campus school but with less time at school and more homework:). No ministry funding is provided to families for classes (marked with F2F in OTIS) and there is a fee. All needed curriculum is provided.
